2019 Membership Fees:

General/Junior: \$55

Family/Joint: \$55 + \$10 for each other member

Associate: \$30

Types of memberships available:

a) General: Is any adult over 18 during the year of membership.

Attracts all the membership discounts afforded at WAAHA events and is eligible to vote at General meetings and to join the Committee.

b) Family/Joint: A Family membership consist of Adults and/or their children. Joint membership shall consist of owners of registered horse in joint names. One adult is to be nominated in writing to represent the Family/Joint membership to vote on its behalf (one single vote) and to join the Committee, and all members of a Family/Joint Membership attract all the membership discounts afforded at WAAHA events.

c) Junior: is anyone under the age of 18 during the year of membership.

Junior members attract all the membership discounts afforded at WAAHA events but Junior members are not eligible to vote or to join the committee.

d) Associate: is anyone who would like to be on the mailing list.

Associate Members are not eligible to vote, to join the committee or to exhibit at any show conducted by the Body at discounted General, Life or Junior Member Rates.

e) Life: being one who has been elected as a life member by committee.

Life Members attract the same rewards as General members.

MEMBERSHIP REWARDS

Our Shows:

The WAAHA Arabian State Championships, — held in March and attracting an international judge. The Feature classes at this show are the Showhorse class, judged on presentation, conformation and workout; and the Freestyle class. In this class, the competitors complete a workout of their own to music. Costumes may also be used to compliment the workout and music.

The WAAHA Trilogy—usually held in the middle of the year. The Trilogy consists of Halter, Saddle Horse of the Year, and a Liberty Class. Horses can do one, two or all three components of the Trilogy.

Another feature of the Trilogy Show is the West Coast Cup—a prestigious hack class.

The WAAHA All Arabian—held in November. Feature classes of this show are our WA Bred classes, dressage on the International Arena, and The ULTIMATE Arabian or Derivative.

The Ultimate horse is usually judged by two judges. Horses placed in both their breed halter and ridden classes are scored against each other, and the horses with the most points earns the title of ULTIMATE Arabian or Derivative.

Gymkhanas, Hack Days and Dressage:

These events are generally held at Perth Horse & Pony Club and are designed to be more low-key than our three A class shows. These events may include halter, ridden, games, novelties, Working Hunter and/or fancy dress classes. These days are usually a lot of fun!

HORSE OF THE YEAR

The competition run includes all the 'A' class shows from January 1 to December 31 each year. Nominations are not required. Sixteen perpetual trophies are awarded in the following categories: Purebred of the Year Halter and Ridden Stallion/Colt, Filly/Mare, and Gelding; Registered Derivative of the Year Halter and Ridden Stallion/Colt, Mare/Filly and Gelding; Arabian Performance Index; Non- Professional of the Year; WA Breeder of the Year; High Point Youth of the Year

Winners are awarded a perpetual trophy and an embroidered woolen rug, a WAAHA T-Shirt or prize deemed suitable by committee.

Points are earned at each of the A class shows—see rules for further details.

High Point Endurance, Dressage or Agricultural Show Horse of the Year

These awards are to encourage members of WAAHA who own Arabian Purebred and Derivative horses to enter WA run Endurance rides, dressage days and Agricultural shows.

Competitors are required to keep a record of their results on a special form, and forward this form to WAAHA by November 30th of that year.

Winners are awarded a prize such as a name plated halter, an embroidered saddle blanket or a prize deemed appropriate by committee.
